



No health insurance? We're here to help!

At Grace Clinic, we want to help you *get healthy* and *stay healthy* by providing basic healthcare services and health education at *no or little cost*. We're located at 170 Claremont Drive near Hugh Chatham Memorial Hospital in Elkin, NC.

What Services Do We Provide?

Our staff and volunteers provide many of the same services you'd get at a doctor's office—regular checkups, help when you're starting to feel sick, health monitoring (for conditions like diabetes or high blood pressure), many laboratory services, and assistance with some medications. Our hours vary. All our services are by appointment. If you have an emergency, you should call 911.

Who We Serve

To be one of our patients, you must be between the ages of 18-64 and have no health insurance. Some exceptions may apply; call and ask us.

You must live in one of these ZIP Code areas:

Your annual household income must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level for the size of your household. For a single person, that means you can earn up to \$21,660 per year (\$417 per week).* For a family of four, the limit is \$44,100 per year (\$848 per week).* The limit changes depending on the number of people in your household.

*These are 2009 figures.
Limits change periodically.

What to Bring

If you'd like to be a patient at Grace Clinic, call us and set up an appointment to get qualified. (This is different from an appointment to receive medical care.) When you come, bring:

- State-issued photo identification showing your current address.
- Any other government-issued identity cards.
- Some other proof of where you live (like a power or water bill).
- A list of everyone in your household—their names, ages, and relationship to you.
- Proof of household income (W-2s; copies of recent tax returns; stubs from paychecks or benefit payments; copies of alimony checks; award letters for child support, Social Security, veteran's benefits, unemployment assistance, or Work First; and a description of any help you receive from other people, ministries, or agencies).
- The bottles for any medications, supplements, or vitamins you take or have recently taken.
- Any other medical records you might have.
- A list of your health questions or concerns.
